Founded in 1991, CFSOS empowers individuals to make a lasting impact in their communities through meaningful giving opportunities. As the hub for the NSG Southern Interior Network, CFSOS fosters connections and inspires grassroots initiatives across the area.



NSG was developed by the Vancouver Foundation in 1999, and working in partnership with local community organizations and foundations, it now serves the whole province of British Columbia.



Applying! DON'T PANIC!

Tips to Writing a Great Application

- ⇒ Bring Your Idea to Life Describe your project vividly—what will the day look and feel like?
- Engage Your Community How will you invite neighbours? Posters, door-to-door, social media?
- Plan Meaningful Activities What will spark conversations and ensure accessibility for all ages?
- S Embrace Diversity & Inclusion Consider food, accessibility, and ways to welcome newcomers.
- Leverage Community Resources Could local speakers, Indigenous knowledge keepers, RDOS, RCMP, or First Responders add value?
- Build Lasting Connections Will you gather contact info or aim to make it an annual event?

Dates to Consider When Planning


- 77 Application Deadline: April 18, 2025
- Independent Review by NSG Grant Committee: Until April 28
- ♣ In-Person Adjudication by NSG Grant Committee: May 5-9
- Grant Distribution: May 26–30
- Project Leader Online Check-In: June 5 | 5:30-6:00 PM
- Projects Can Begin: After June 15
- Projects Must Be Completed By: November 30, 2025

Your Budget

- List All Project Expenses Identify everything you'll need to bring your idea to life.
- Grant Request Keep your total request under \$500.
- Project Activities Budget for games, crafts, and building/beautifying activities.
- **Prizes & Giveaways Consider costs for tools, plants, or unexpected.
- Estimate Attendees Plan for supplies and food based on expected numbers.
- Food Costs Must be included in your budget or proposal
- ➡ Honorariums Permissible allocations:
 - Up to \$350 Hosting a series of events
 - Up to \$350 Indigenous knowledge sharers /series
 - Up to \$350 Musicians
 - Up to \$100 Guest speakers, makers, or specialized skills
 - (Honorariums do not replace professional fees.)

Budget Costs Not Permitted

- Need clarity? Connect with the NSG Coordinator!
- - Single-item expenses Entire budget on food, t-shirts, or books
 - Bouncy castles Not covered
 - Professional fees Honorariums allowed, but not full professional rates
 - Travel costs Not eligible
 - Capital costs No funding for large equipment or infrastructure
 - Fundraisers Grant funds cannot be redirected as donations
 - Online-only purchases BUY LOCAL whenever possible




How Your Application will be scored

Each application is evaluated out of 25 points (1-5 per category):

- Fostering Connections & Engagement Does the project bring neighbours together in meaningful ways?
- Belonging & Community Responsibility Does it create a welcoming and inclusive sense of community?
- * Skill Sharing & Knowledge Exchange Does it promote learning and sharing among participants?
- ♠ Diversity, Inclusion & Accessibility Is the project accessible and welcoming to all?
- Sudget Feasibility Is the budget clear, realistic, and aligned with NSG guidelines?



Creating Your Profile

Our grant system is designed to accept applications only from non-profits. Please follow the prompts accordingly.



Consider Your Event Location

On a street

- Suitable for larger gatherings
- Must be on local road or cul de sac and not a busy road
- You will need to have \$2 million in liability insurance. Contact your provider, or purchase insurance.
- You will need to get permission to close your street
- Personal consideration: people can go home quickly to use the bathroom

In a park

- Suitable for large or small gatherings
- Learn more about hosting an event with your local government
- You will need to have \$2 million in liability insurance
- Public washrooms

On private property

- For smaller gatherings, a lawn party can work well
- No permits are required
- You may need 3rd party insurance
- Comfortable with people in your house?




Quick Tips

- Don't host on an NSG on a long weekend people are usually booked
- Bring a child with you to give out invitations
- Have a THEME
- GAMES to get the conversations flowing with laughs
- Have a safety plan & a First Aid kit available, fire extinguisher
- WELCOME TABLE with name tags (use colour pens and stickers)
- Create a neighbourhood contact list or a Facebook page
- Research ideas!



Responsibility of grantee/ Project Leader



Expectations & Responsibilities of a Grantee

- ✓ Review your Letter of Award & Action Prompts
- Stay connected with the NSG Coordinator—send an invite!
- Acknowledge NSG by including the logo on materials
- Use funds according to your approved budget
- Complete your project within the given timeframe
- Share your impact by uploading photos and a project story to the grant portal

Inspire others


By sharing your story you are inspiring other people in the community to apply or contribute to their neighbourhood.
